<b>Exposure/ Hypothermia and Sunburn</b>	All	Sunburn, high temperature and dehydration.	1	2	2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Participants urged to make sure they have suitable clothing prior to the activity.</li> <li>Participants to drink plenty of water.</li> <li>Sun cream to be applied when needed.</li> </ul>	1	2	2
<b>Group Behaviour</b>	All	Loss of control of the group, participants being distracted/ not listening.	2	2	4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Group leaders are to ensure that the group is under control at all times.</li> <li>Group leader to stop the session if participant's behaviour becomes dangerous.</li> </ul>	1	2	2
<b>Adverse Weather</b>	All	See 'Exposure'	2	3	6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Advice is given on what to do in the occurrence of adverse weather.</li> <li>Participants are advised to wear suitable clothing for weather conditions.</li> <li>Refer to 'Adverse Weather' policy.</li> </ul>	1	3	3
<b>Injuries to a Lone Group Member</b>	All	Not being able to receive help whilst injured.	2	3	6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Group must be minimum of three participants.</li> <li>In the event of a party member getting injured at least one person is to stay with the injured member while the rest of the group goes for help.</li> <li>Group leader is to deal with first aid, help is available from reception.</li> </ul>	1	3	3
<b>Participants Getting Lost</b>	All	Emotional distress and not being able to receive help whilst injuries.	2	2	4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Group leaders are told about the site having boundary fences around the whole site and they are to stay on site.</li> <li>There is no need to go off site for this activity.</li> <li>Younger participants are advised to have adults in the group.</li> <li>The group are given a Frisbee Golf map on back of score sheet.</li> </ul>	1	2	2
<b>Equipment Failure</b>	All	Cuts, Lacerations, Death	3	5	15	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All equipment is inspected periodically and anything faulty is removed from use immediately, recorded and repaired or replaced.</li> </ul>	1	5	5

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Level	Likelihood Factor	Severity Description
1	Very Unlikely	Insignificant – No injury or No First Aid required.
2	Unlikely	Minor – Minor injuries requiring first aid such as cuts, grazes, bruising.
3	Fairly Likely	Moderate – Injuries resulting in up to three days' absence from work.
4	Likely	Major – Injuries resulting in a week or more absence from work, for example broken bones, deep cut etc.
5	Very Likely	Catastrophic – Amputations or Death.

Remaining Risk Level	Description
1-5	Very low, minimal risk, control measures more than adequate
5-10	Low, control measures satisfactory
10-15	Medium, control measures adequate
15-20	High, control measures need further consideration
20-25	Very high, intolerable, stop Job
